Among the two most important are #5 and #7; be sure to have a main idea to deliver or a central question to examine, and think about how to get us talking about it.

PLANNING

- 1. Depth and breadth of preparation.
- 2. Demonstrates mastery of the topic.
- 3. Prepared for the presentation on time.

PLANNING OF PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION

- 4. Conveys its message.
- 5. Delivers a main idea.
- 6. Includes the class in presentation and discussion.
- 7. Presents questions, materials, or activities that generate discussion among the class.

DELIVERY

- 8. Fits time guidelines.
- 9. Involves looking at people.
- 10. Holds listeners' attention.
- 11. Enunciates clearly and confidently.

FOLLOW-UP

- 12. Handles questions well.
- 13. Tests understanding.
