


KEY ORIENTATIONS OF "WHAT IS CAPITALISM?" CLASS:

- 1) Need to think about "economics" in more expansive way; referencing back to older models of *political economy* (while bringing in social, cultural and environmental)
- 2) Thinking about the evidence for our views how do we judge what is good information or knowledge? How do our media ecologies shape our views? How can we think more critically and in-depth through our discussions and debates with each other?
- 3) This is an exploration of capitalism so the "?" is key! It's an exploration in two senses taking a larger big picture frame focuses on ideas and understandings of capitalism and then honing in on how capitalism plays our for people in their everyday lives
