What are range of types of governments/economic arrangements confusingly referred to as "socialism":

- Communist countries Soviet Union and satellites centralized authoritarian governments and centralized planning; (Verdery refers to these as "state socialist" societies)
- 2) Market-based democracies w/ strong welfare states Nordic countries
- 3) Marxist movements in formerly colonized regions in post-independence period of 60s-70s that followed still other logics Ethiopia




