#### Japan's Arrival as Great Power

•July 1905, Taft-Katsura Agreement

•August, Anglo-Japanese Treaty extended

November 1905: Korea becomes protectorate
1909, Ito assassinated
August 1910, Korea formally annexed

#### Domestic Consequences

•1/5 of men directly mobilized: I million men to the war (100,000 deaths)

Industrial base

•x8~x10 cost of Sino-Japanese War

Unprecedented level of heightened political awareness
awareness of war
rising expectations > riots when betrayed
