Brutus – Founder of the Republic

The Decii – Father and son, political/military leaders of 4<sup>th</sup>-early 3<sup>rd</sup> c. BC

The Drusi – Important Republican family

Torquatus – Mid 4<sup>th</sup> c. BC Roman consul, killed own son for insubordination

Camillus – Republican leader, exiled, returns to save Rome from Gauls in 390 BC

**Julius Caesar** – Military dynast and dictator, 49-44 BC

Pompey – Military dynast

Mummius – Conqueror of Corinth in 146 BC

Paullus – 2<sup>nd</sup> c. BC military hero, conqueror of Perseus of Macedon in 167 BC

Cato – Censor 184 BC, dominant political figure of early 2<sup>nd</sup> c. BC

Cossus

- General of the 5<sup>th</sup> c. BC, won *spolia opima* for killing king of Veii

The Gracchi

- Powerful family, including popular politicians of the late 2<sup>nd</sup> c. BC

The Scipios

- Powerful family, conquerors of Carthage in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Punic Wars

Fabricius

- Austere and virtuous leader, conqueror of Pyrrhus in early 3<sup>rd</sup> c. BC

Serranus – Consul and hero of the 1<sup>st</sup> Punic War of mid 3<sup>rd</sup> c. BC

The Fabii – Another famously powerful family of the Republic

Maximus – Saved Rome from Hannibal in late 3<sup>rd</sup> c. BC

Marcellus- General of the later 3rd c. BCMarcellus- Nephew of Augustus, died 23 BC
