Forms commonly employed in the Classical Era

SONATA FORM

-typically used in first movements

-can be used in slow movements or final movements

-can be preceded by a slow introduction and concluded with a coda

VARIATION FORM

- a theme (in this case in binary form or a:||:b) plus other statements of that theme in which different musical elements are changed A A' A'' A''' ...

MINUET AND TRIO

-usually third (sometimes second) movement form for symphonies and string quartets -carry over from Baroque dance pairs -triple meter dance-inspired movement

A = Minuet		B= Trio (contrasting but related key)	Minuet da capo

Rondo

-usually last-movement form for symphonies, sonatas, string quartets, concertos, etc. -alternating pattern of a rondo theme (tonic) and episodes (other key areas)

-rondo theme can be antecedent/consequent, binary, rounded binary, etc.
