## Class 2

How do we recognize the work as belonging to a genre? Where do the edges blur? Are there any "pure" works?

Genre as a <u>lens</u> to interpret/focus/understand <u>contemporary</u> experience.

We write from <u>now</u> - what we imagine of the past or the future is informed by the present, by our social and personal and economic and political concerns. Examples!

Popularity of preternatural romance - Vampire and Sexuality (from Victorian/Dracula)

Exercise - take an incident from your own life - write within your genre.

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Laetz and Johnson -
Get lots wrong
Terrible sentences!!
Very cliché notion of fantasy - they clearly don't know the genre - be angry!

"reality"
fictional = incorrect????
vs. true crime

But - they do pose some real questions -
What makes something fantasy?
Pern (Dragons)
or SF, or mystery, or horror

That element is central to the structure and construction of the story.
