A mini-argument for covert wh-movement in English multiple questions

- a. Mary knows which picture of herself John is looking at _
- b. *Mary knows that John is looking at a picture of herself

(2) Looks like covert wh-movement does not...

*Mary knows which man was looking at which picture of herself

(3) ...but perhaps covert Bulgarian-style"tucking-in" causes the higher *wh*-phrase to count as an intervening subject for Principle A...

 $Mary \, knows [which \, man]_i [which \, picture \, of \, herself]_{j-i} \, was \, looking \, at_{-j}$

(4) ...as Bulgarian suggests:

- a. *Meri; znae [koje momče]; [koja svoja; snimka], kupi ___, ___ (Roumyana Pancheva, p.c.)

 Mary; knows [which boy]; [which refl; picture], bought ___, ___ (*Mary knows which boy bought which picture of himself/*herself')
- b. ? **Meri**_i znae [koj **svoj**_i brat]_j [koja snimka]_k kupi _{-j -k} **Mary**_i knows [which **refl**_i brother]_j [which picture]_k bought _{-j -k}

 'Mary knows which of her(self's) brothers bought which book'

(5) English!

- a. Which boy, thinks that Mary was looking at which picture of himself;?
- b. *Which boy thinks that Mary was looking at a picture of himself?

(6) Successive-cyclic covert movement?

- a. Which boy thinks **Mary**; wants him to buy which picture of herself;?
 - b. *Which boy thinks Mary wants him to buy a picture of herself?
