# BRIEF DOORS

Reconfiguring Property Access In just minutes

There are hundreds of millions of curators across the Earth. Anyone with a wall and a door and a rule. If you want to help them curate this museum, but don't have any property, you need a brief door. A brief door can be carried around and quickly installed on almost any regular door. And the rules for passing through can be modified to anything you can think of. For example, if you noticed that the museum didn't have many places with the rule "you'll only," you could use a brief door to change a normal door to try out that rule really fast.
