## Problem 1 OCT's and transfer functions

Consider the following amplifier:


- $\beta \rightarrow \infty$
- $C_{\pi}=0$
- $C_{\mu}=100 \mathrm{fF}$
- $C_{o}=C_{i n}=1 \mathrm{pF}$
- Assume $I_{c 1}=I_{c 2}=I_{c 3}=I_{c 4}$
- Do not ignore the Early effect.
(a) Solve for the following transfer functions
- $\frac{v_{\text {out }}}{i_{\text {in }}}$
- $\frac{v_{f}}{v_{o u t}}$
- $v_{i n}\left(v_{f}, i_{i n}\right)$
(b) Approximate the 3 dB frequency $\left(f_{3 d B}\right)$ using the method of open circuit time constants. Make reasonable approximations.


## Problem 2 Op amps

A three-stage BJT op-amp is shown below. Assume $V_{B E, o n}=0.7 \mathrm{~V}, \beta=100, V_{A}=2.5 \mathrm{~V}, \frac{k T}{q}=25 \mathrm{mV}$.

(a) Calculate all collector currents
(b) Calculate the low-frequency gain of each stage. Include $r_{\pi}$ 's and $r_{o}$ 's in your calculation.
(c) Explain the function of the 2nd stage.
(d) The dynamics of the amplifier are dominated by $C_{1}$. Estimate the location of the lowest frequency pole in terms of $C_{1}$ and quantities involved in part (b).

## Problem 3 Op Amp applications

Note: For parts (a) and (b) you may assume the op amps and diodes are ideal.
(a) Derive the voltage $v_{o}$ as a function of $v_{I}$ and $v_{A}$ in the following circuit

(b) Derive $v_{A}$ as a function of $v_{I}$ in the following circuit when:

1. $v_{I}>0$
2. $v_{I}<0$

(c) What function is implemented by the following circuit? Give both a qualitative and quantitative $\left(\frac{v_{o}}{v_{I}}\right)$ answer.

(d) Now consider the diodes to be nonideal (i.e., they have a forward drop of 0.6 V when conducting). What is the output voltage $v_{A}$ of the circuit in part (b) under this condition?


## Problem 4 Charge Control

An inverter circuit is shown below


The transistor has negligible space-charge layer capacitances. In this case, the charge control equations are

i_{C} & =\frac{q_{F}}{\tau_{F}}-q_{R}\left(\frac{1}{\tau_{R}}+\frac{1}{\tau_{B R}}\right)-\frac{d q_{R}}{d t} \\
i_{B} & =\frac{q_{F}}{\tau_{B F}}+\frac{d q_{F}}{d t}+\frac{q_{R}}{\tau_{B R}}+\frac{d q_{R}}{d t} \\
i_{E} & =\frac{q_{F}}{\tau_{B F}}-q_{F}\left(\frac{1}{\tau_{F}}+\frac{1}{\tau_{B F}}\right)-\frac{d q_{F}}{d t}
\end{aligned}
$$

When the transistor is in saturation

$$
i_{B}-i_{B o}=\frac{q_{S}}{\tau_{S}}+\frac{d q_{S}}{d t}
$$

The transistor parameters are

| $\tau_{F}=1 \mathrm{~ns}$ | $\beta_{F}=100$ | $\tau_{B F}=100 \mathrm{~ns}$ | $\tau_{S}=15.1 \mathrm{~ns}$ |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| $\tau_{R}=2 \mathrm{~ns}$ | $\beta_{R}=5$ | $\tau_{B R}=10 \mathrm{~ns}$ |  |

(a) The circuit is initially configured with switch 1 open and switch 2 closed. Input voltage $v_{I}(t)$ is a 10.7 volt step and the initial value of the capacitor voltage is zero. Find $i_{C}(t)$ valid for all time slightly greater than zero.
(b) Switch 1 is now closed. Other conditions remain the same as for part (a). Find the value of $R$ that makes $i_{C}$ a constant for all time slightly greater than zero.
(c) Switches 1 and 2 are now both opened. With $v_{I}(t)$ a 10.7 V step and zero initial capacitor voltage, the voltage $v_{o}(t)$ is given by the following graph


What are the values of delay time $T_{D}$ and $\tau_{1}$ ? You may express $T_{D}$ in terms of logarithms if you wish.
(d) The circuit is now operated with switch 1 closed and switch 2 open, $R=2.5 \mathrm{k} \Omega$, and $v_{I}$ a constant 10.7 volts. After equilibrium is reached switch 2 is closed. What is the value of $i_{C}$ slightly after the switch is closed? What is the final value of $i_{C}$ ?

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
